The fifteen eyewitness commentaries on U.S. naval operations in Vietnam that form the core of this essay collection represent the first serious attempts to describe the naval side of the war. Editor Frank Uhlig commissioned each essay after traveling to Vietnam during the war years to determine for himself what was happening and who was most qualified to describe it. The individuals he selected are chiefly the men who did what they wrote about. Originally published in the Naval Institute's annual *Naval Review* between 1967 and 1972, these essays have now been collected into one convenient volume to make them available to a broad audience.

The authors, most of whom were officers either in command or key staff positions, describe the activities of the forces they knew best: the Navy, the Marines, the Coast Guard, and the Merchant Marine. Each author tells what he was attempting, what his foes were attempting, and what actually happened. From the Tonkin Gulf in the north to the Gulf of Thailand in the south, operations afloat, aloft, and ashore are discussed. Both combatant and logistical aspects of the war are covered.

The editor's incisive introductory comments and five additional essays that he wrote especially for this book give a full appreciation of the eyewitness commentaries. Complementing the text are a number of maps that allow the reader to track the actions described.

Everyone wanting to learn more about what happened in America's longest war will find this insightful book to be a valuable document.

Frank Uhlig, Jr., is publisher of the Naval War College Review and Naval War College Press and heads the advanced research program at the war college, which is located in Newport, Rhode Island. From 1960 to 1981 he was with the U.S. Naval Institute in Annapolis, first in the book department, then as editor of the Naval Review and senior editor of the Institute. He is a 1951 graduate of Kenyon College, where he majored in history, and served in the U.S. Navy from 1945 to 1946.

Uhlig has written on a wide range of topics for numerous international naval journals, and many of his articles have been published in books.
